**One of three feasts per year at which all the males were required to appear before the Lord.

An ephah is about 6 gallons. The chart gives flour (ephah) measurements in quarts (qt.).

The drink offering in Scripture was poured out to the Lord and was measured in fractions of hins. The exact amount of a hin is disputed (from 4 quarts to 8 quarts).

This chart considers a hin to be 4 quarts and states the wine measurement in quarts (qt.).
