Memory Verses, Joshua 1:5, 7–9; 24:14, 15, 20, 24–26 (ESV)

- M1 [God said,] "I will be with thee: I will not fail thee, nor forsake thee. . . . Only be thou strong and very courageous, that thou mayest observe to do according to all the law,
- M2 "which Moses my servant commanded thee: turn not from it to the right hand or to the left, that thou mayest prosper withersoever thou goest.
- M3 "This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.
- M4 "Have not I commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the Lord thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest."
- M5 [Joshua said,] "Now therefore fear the Lord, and serve him in sincerity and in truth: and put away the gods which your fathers served . . . and serve ye the Lord.
- M6 "And if it seem evil unto you to serve the Lord, choose you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the flood, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.
- M7 "If ye forsake the Lord, and serve strange gods, then he will turn and do you hurt, and consume you, after that he hath done you good."
- M8 And the people said unto Joshua, "The Lord our God will we serve, and his voice will we obey."
- M9 So Joshua made a covenant with the people that day, and set them a statute and an ordinance . . . and wrote these words in the book of the law of God.

Questions and Answers

- 1. What is a covenant? An agreement between two or more persons
- 2. What is a God-made covenant? A promise that God gives to His people and establishes by His unchangeable Word
- 3. Why did God make covenants with His people? God's eternal plan is to reveal Himself to us through His covenant promises
- 4. What command did God give to Adam? Not to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

- 5. What was Adam bound to do by God's command? To obey God perfectly.
- 6. What did God promise in His command to Adam? To punish Adam with death if he disobeyed.
- 7. Did Adam keep God's command? No; he sinned against God.
- 8. What covenant did God make with Jesus Christ, His Son? The covenant of grace.
- 9. What is the covenant of grace? An eternal agreement within the Trinity to save certain persons called the elect, and to provide all the means for their salvation.
- 10. What did Christ undertake in the covenant of grace? To keep the whole law for His people and to suffer the punishment due to their sins.
- 11. Did our Lord Jesus Christ ever commit the least sin? No; He was holy, blameless, and undefiled.
- 12. How could the Son of God suffer? Christ, the Son of God, took flesh and blood that He might obey and suffer as a man.
- 13. What is meant by the atonement? Christ's satisfying divine justice by His sufferings and death in the place of sinners.
- 14. What did God the Father undertake in the covenant of grace? To justify and sanctify those for whom Christ should die.
- 15. What is justification? God's regarding sinners as if they had never sinned.
- 16. What is sanctification? God's making sinners holy in heart and conduct.
- 17. For whom did Christ obey and suffer? For those whom the Father had given Him.
- 18. What kind of life did Christ live on earth? A life of perfect obedience to the law of God.
- 19. What kind of death did Christ die? The painful and shameful death of the cross.
- 20. Who will be saved? Only those who repent of sin adn believe in Christ.
- 21. What is it to repent? To be sorry for sin and to hate and forsake it because it is displeasing to God.
- 22. What is it to believe in Christ? To trust in Christ alone for salvation.
- 23. Can anyone repent and believe in Christ by one's own power? No; we can do nothing good without God's Holy Spirit.
